Dear Friends.

Chester County Futures (CCF) continued to serve over 264 middle and high school students and 154 college students with in-depth services and experiential learning opportunities in the 2018-19 school year. We proudly report a 100% graduation rate for the class of 2019, with 87% matriculation to college and trade schools in the fall.

Activity highlights from the 2018-19 school year include:

- Our high school students participated in corporate site visits to SEI, Dansko, Cerner, and Microsoft. Our rising college freshman spent a full day at SAP attending the CCF College Boot Camp in order to prepare them for their first year in college.
- As our high school students mature, we look to bring them to corporations that relate to their fields of interest. A select group of students interested in medical careers spent the day at DePuy Synthes in workshops, small group career discussions and hands-on participation in work done in the saw-bone labs.
- Students toured the campuses of Elizabethtown College, Penn State Berks Campus, Widener University and West Chester University, Health Sciences.
- CCF became a Federal Work Study outlet for Delaware County Community College, providing work opportunities to our alumni. This opportunity provided part-time jobs for our students while funding sixty free work hours per week to CCF in the communications, program and development departments.
- The year also saw the election of six (6) new board members with diverse skill sets and personal as well as professional contacts.

We are deeply grateful to our community at large for their support. We continue to mindfully manage our resources, improve our programs and invest in our young people. We promise to be good stewards of your generous donations and thank you for placing your trust in us and our motivated students. Together, we are empowering their lives through education.

THE MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

Futures AHEAD is designed to provide early intervention to lowincome students to set them on the path toward higher education. Multiyear enrichment camps and monthly meetings focus on:

- Academic accountability & success
- Options in higher education
- 21st century workplace skills
- Interpersonal skills

Passport to College is designed to equip and empower students for educational and life success through after-school academic enrichment classes and real world learning opportunities. Curriculum includes activities and discussions on relevant, grade-appropriate

Academic skills

topics, such as:

- SAT preparation & test-taking skills
- 21st century workplace skills
- Financial literacy
- Community volunteerism
- College selection & application support
- Financial aid application support
- Career exploration
- Technology provision

STEPS 4 SUCCESS POST-SECONDARY PROGRAM

Supports post-secondary students as they navigate the unfamiliar college landscape by providing academic, professional, and social guidance, as well as distributing post-secondary scholarship funds and technology.

Once a Futures student enters postsecondary school, they are eligible to receive up to \$6,000 in scholarship funds. A critical part of this program is the annual College Prep Boot Camp.







CCF Partners With Sixers Youth Foundation!



Futures AHEAD is the first academic enrichment program in the country to receive a grant from the Sixers Youth Foundation

The \$25,000 grant award will support academic enrichment activities for students aged 12-14 across four districts: Coatesville, Kennett, Oxford, and Phoenixville. Futures AHEAD provides early intervention, STEM exposure, academic advising and career exploration for economically disadvantaged youth.





A group of lucky young women from Chester County Futures Phoenixville program Microsoft joined over 150 girls at the Microsoft Technology Center.

They participated in interactive workshops for coding, artificial intelligence, as well as other innovative technologies. Additionally, female speakers in STEM industry's spoke with the students about future educational and professional opportunities in this burgeoning field.

My name is Brittany Chavez, I am a first-generation college Hispanic student which Chester County Futures has helped in ways I didn't know I needed in. Being a reckless teenager in middle school, bad notes, broken rules, and embarrassing behavior. I was lost to the point of almost repeating freshman year in high school.

CCF invited me to join their program and I gladly accepted in hopes of receiving help. CCF has helped me unleash the best version of myself as a dedicated, studious, and self-advocated person. Every year that has gone by in the program, I have learned how important it is to continue a secondary education and never feel held back no matter your ethnicity or background. Being paired with a mentor with the same personality as me, similar background, and connections towards the major I wanted to pursue is the best thing that could have ever happened to me.

My mentor, Eva, has gone from a mentor to a very important part of my family who I could not go without, she has taught me that I am capable of much more than I could ever believe, all I have to do is have faith and do my best. If it weren't for Chester County Futures, I would have never become brave enough to apply towards a college or any scholarship, never would've known what an SAT was, let alone take one, I would have become another Hispanic stereotype who works all their life non-stop after graduating.

My greatest accomplishment in CCF would be applying to my dream college and getting accepted into its meteorology program. Remembering the day of arrival of the news still gives me chills and makes me smile in pride, being a person with the lowest hopes of being accepted due to my ethnicity, an open door to college made me feel powerful. The feeling that I could become more than what I am, go further than anyone in my family ever, possibly live the famous "American dream", means everything to me. Sometimes I still can't believe how far I've gone and how much I've accomplished, many have put me down, discouraged my dreams, said I would never do it, even made fun of my Spanish accent. If only they could see the strength I've gained from my journey with CCF, I believe they wouldn't recognize the Brittany I've become.




